

## Pinecone Mouse

## What you'll need:



- 1 small pinecone (for body)
- 1 short brown or pink pipe cleaner (for tail)
- Acrylic paint (pink)
- Small paintbrushes, glue and scissors



1 Take the large pinecone and cut off and shape two large scales for the ears

Paint the inner ears pink (or leave them natural)

3 Paint the tip of the pinecone pink to form the nose

4 Curl the pipe cleaner and attach it to the pinecone to make the tail

Once the paint is dry, attach the ears with glue
